**Covid-19 Updates** 



#### **New Covid-10 Dashboard**

As a result of recent changes to policy, the number of detected cases alone no longer provides an accurate or consistent indication of the prevalence of Covid-19 in our community. As a result of this, detailed cases data such as the map and district level figures have been removed from our Dashboard. Cases are still shown on the chart, however, we have now included additional information (ONS Prevalence\*) that may give a better indication of the actual number of people with COVID. Testing data has also been added to provide further context.

Additionally, the hospital admissions data now includes patients with covid19 requiring mechanical ventilation, as a better indicator of levels of serious illness from covid19, rather than hospitalisations alone. The OPEL level on this page provides a snapshot of how the health and care system overall is managing the demands for service.

The vaccination page now provides more overall strategic vision of how the vaccination programme has been implemented and provides an indication of the effective level of immunity provided to our community by boosters and third doses.

\*ONS Prevalence Survey estimates the proportion of people in Somerset testing positive based on samples taken from a selection of our population, by the Office for National Statistics (ONS).

# **Covid-19 Vaccinations**

The Covid-19 vaccination is our first line of defence against the coronavirus and the very best way to keep communities safe.

They are **free in the UK** and everyone should have two doses or more to be fully vaccinated against Covid-19.

# **Spring Booster Vaccination**

The Spring Booster vaccination for all over 75s and the immunosuppressed is now due.

All persons in eligible groups will receive direct communication to assist them with arranging a suitable and local appointment or appointments can be made directly by calling 119, booking online or finding a local walk-in clinic here.

The UK Health Security Agency published guidance on the spring Covid-19 booster offer for those aged 75 years and older, residents in care homes and those aged 12 years and over with a weakened immune system. Further info can be found here.

Please encourage those eligible to go online and book their jab, or call 119 for an appointment. You are also able to visit a walk-in vaccination site for your Spring Booster.



If you had your first booster 6+ months ago, you can now get a second booster.

#### 12-15 Vaccine

Although the in-school Covid-19 vaccination programme for 12 to 15 year olds has ended, young people are still able to access the vaccine outside of school, at a vaccination centre, pharmacy or <u>walk-in centre</u>.

## 5-11 Vaccine

All healthy 5-11s are now eligible for their vaccine. <u>Bookings</u> can be made at a wide number of clinics across Somerset or <u>Walk-in</u> appointments additionally being offered at Tower Vaccination Centre in Taunton on specific days.

Over the half term there will also be dedicated children only days for appointments and walk-ins at Verrington (Wincanton Community Hospital) and Tower Vaccination in Taunton on Monday 30th and Wednesday 1st June. All children's clinics allow additional time with the specialist and trained staff to reassure and support families during their appointment.
